To realize objectives of the scheme & reliable financial reporting on its operations emphasis is being laid on completing the audit of fund utilized under DMF at least on completion of financial year.

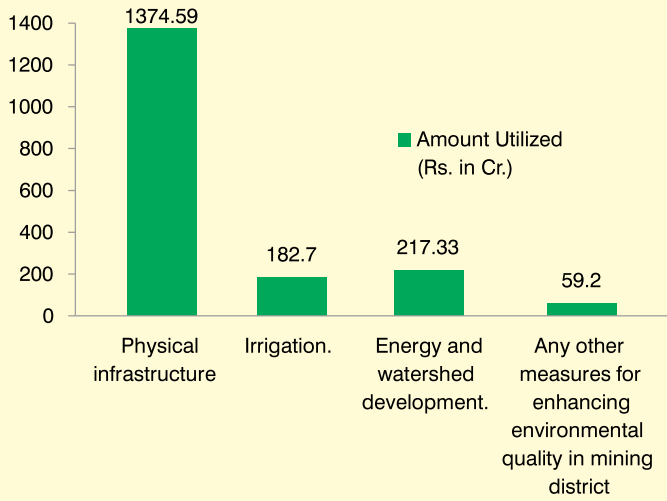
Planning

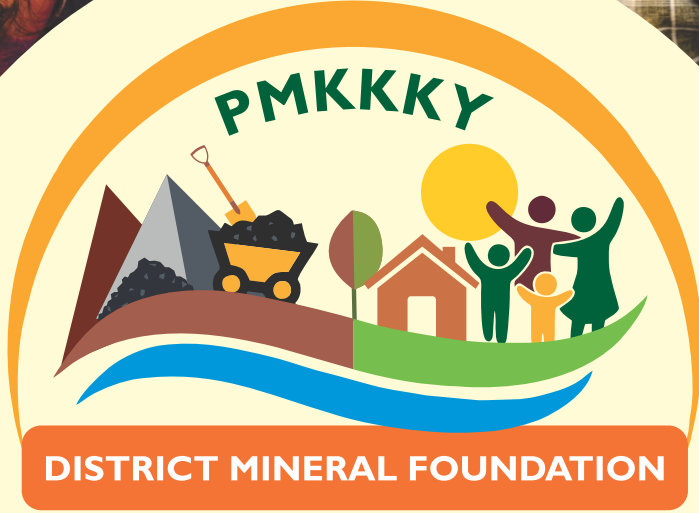
PMKKKY Portal

DMF - PMKKKY

Government of India made an amendment to the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act (1957) in January 2015, making provision for the establishment of District Mineral Foundation (DMF) in any district affected by mining related operations. The DMFs are meant to address the long standing demand of the local people in mining areas for inclusive growth.

The DMFs are funded by statutory contributions from holders of mining lease.

The DMF is to be funded in the following manner:

- (a) 10% of royalty paid in respect of mining leases granted on or after 12th January, 2015; and
- (b) 30% of royalty paid in respect of mining leases granted before 12th January, 2015

The Government has formulated Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojana (PMKKKY) to be implemented by the DMFs of the respective districts. It has been issued as a directive under Section 20A of the Act by the Central government on 16.09.2015. The objective of PMKKKY scheme will be:

- (a) to implement various developmental and welfare projects/programs in mining affected areas
- (b) to minimize/mitigate the adverse impacts, during and after mining, on the environment, health and socio-economics of people.
- (c) to ensure long-term sustainable livelihoods for the affected people.

It is in the interest of the State Governments to expedite the setting up of DMF so that these funds being accrued may start getting utilized for the welfare and development of these areas as laid down by the PMKKKY scheme.

The key statistics are as below:

- Total funds to the tune of Rs. 23, 000 crore have been collected under DMF.
- Top 5 States with maximum collection are **Odisha (Rs. 5838.26 Crore) , Jharkhand (Rs. 3426.69 Crore), Chhattisgarh (Rs. 3336.29 Crore), Rajasthan (Rs. 2340.05 Crore), Telangana (Rs. 2028.87 Crore)**
- Top 5 Districts with maximum collection are **Keonjhar in Odisha – Rs. 2217.22 crore, Korba in Chhattisgarh – Rs. 1275.96 crore, Singrauli in Madhya Pradesh – Rs. 1131.89 crore, Sundergarh in Odisha – Rs 1077.06 crore and Angul in Odisha – Rs.924.91 crore.**
