Revised Agenda for the Coordination-cum-Empowered Committee on Mineral Development and Regulation, to be held on 3rd Feb, 2017 at 11 am in India Habitat Centre, New Delhi

1. **Auction Preparedness of blocks for 2017-18 already under preparation by the States** - The block-wise preparedness of other blocks for auction by the respective State Government, in 2017-18, will be discussed. The timelines associated with the pipeline of blocks available for auction (**Annexure I**) to be confirmed in the meeting. Any further addition deletion in the list may kindly be provided in advance.
2. **Auction preparedness for the blocks for which lease could not executed as per deadline under section 10A(2)(C) of MMDR Amendment Act, 2015:** It is required to expedite action to put the mineral blocks, of all the lapsed applications of section 10A(2)(c), on auction expeditiously. It can be seen from the data compiled on **Annexure II** that there are about 231 of these blocks available (with advance stage preparation for Mining) which could not be executed for putting up on auction by the States. These blocks would be immediately available for putting up on auction by the States. The State Governemnt may also take immediate steps to file caveat in the respective courts for preventing stay, if any, in going for auction. The detailed status of all the blocks of lapsed applcation covered under section 10A(2)(c), may be provided in the following format –

3. **Outcome of cases covered under section 10A(2)(c):** The State Government may update the data in the proforma (**Annexure II**) already compiled on the basis of the information given earlier, along with giving detailed list of cases of items indicated in the proforma.
4. **Handholding requirements of the States:** The Ministry of Mines has already facilitated the auction process extending support from its offices – IBM & GSI and various PSU's such as MSTC, MECON, MECL & SBICAP. The State Governments may give any further handholding requirements for auction of these mineral blocks of lapsed leases.
5. **Preparation of mineral blocks for auction under new mineral exploration policy –** The blocks to be available for auction in future which are being explored under NMET or

being explored by GSI, MECL on their own or are being explored by entities under the new exploration policy.

6. Status of project implementation under Pradhan Mantri Khanij Kshetra Kalyan Yojana (PMKKKY) : The status of collection of the money accrued in the DMF funds by the State Government and its utilization would be discussed. The information regarding DMF / PMKKKY implementation may be compiled in the format given in **Annexure III**, for the meeting and emailed on pv.kumar70@nic.in or nitin.bharti@nic.in.

7. Status of clearance associated with 21 auctioned blocks : The details about issuance of LoI, upfront payment if any, mining plan and preparedness for EC and FC clearances to be indicated blocks wise. Ministry of Mines has developed a portal i.e. Transparency, Auction Monitoring and Resource Augmentation (TAMRA) which is being launched shortly. A short presentation will be made inviting attention of the states for assistance required in dealing with the requirement of the portal.

8. Curbing illegal mining through Mining Surveillance System (MSS) - The MSS has been developed for monitoring major mineral leases with the help of remote sensing to check any illegal mining cases. The States are required to get the field verification done of the trigger generated by the MSS within the specified time period of 7 days, through the district level officers. The status of field verification of initial triggers and the action taken will be discussed in the meeting. Moreover, this system can also be leveraged for curbing illegal mining in minor minerals, where it is all the more rampant. The implementation of MSS for 'minor minerals' needs to be taken up by the State Governments with the support of State Remote Sensing centres on expeditiously for which a time-bound action plan is required.

9. Preparedness of states in dealing with Skill Development Agenda in line with National Skill Qualification Framework: A short presentation will be made by Skill Council for Mining Section (SCMS) before states being asked for the progress.
